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A word from the DIRECTOR

Praise God! Indeed He has been our Guide and Protector as we reflect on our milestones as a high school. The year 2020 began on a high note with the pioneer Class of 2019 graduation. We celebrated the 100% pass of our KCSE candidates on 11th January. A few weeks later, this was the first message that I wrote to parents in 2020.

"We thank God, our Ebenezer, for this far He has been with us and guided us into the year 2020, a new decade. We can only imagine what blessings He has in store for those who love Him! We are excited about moving forward with the school's expansion plans and impacting more students and parents of our community."

At that time who would have imagined how the year would unfold. Both the teachers and students as well as our parents had no idea that Kenya would be affected by the global, covid-19 pandemic. Looking back, the year 2020 reads like a fictional novel ... schools shut down, churches closed, families sheltered indoors, working from home or not working at all. By God's grace we are truly thankful to the Lord for His watch and care over our lives.

On 15th March, 2020, President Kenyatta announced to the nation that schools would be closed due to the highly contagious spread of covid-19. We quickly arranged staff meetings for different sections of the school. Parents were requested to collect textbooks and assignments for the students. What we anticipated would be a two-week break turned into a seven-month shutdown for all of the students except those in Grade 4, Standard 8 and Form 4, who returned on 12th October, 2020. We were filled with uncertainties. Would the curriculum be covered or would the academic year be wasted? How would the national exams be rescheduled? Since our school follows the 8-4-4 and the 2-6-3-3 curriculums outlined by the Ministry of Education, we depended on the news stations, newspapers and roadside announcements to plan as various options on the way forward were considered.

Shifting to a digital classroom required maximum collaboration and cooperation. Since schools did not reopen in May, 2020, our teachers pivoted quickly to online learning. With the support of our parents

who supplied devices and wifi connection, we tried to make the best of the new-normal circumstances. At the beginning, many parents were also able to work from home (WFH) so supervision was possible. With the ominous announcement that 2020 was cancelled and that all students would repeat in 2021, there was decreased motivation to continue e-learning in September. Public outcry and feedback from the educational sector, however, resulted in a plan that would recover the two missed terms by expanding to four terms in both 2021 and 2022.

All of us were touched one way or another by the passing of a relative, neighbour or friend. Although the death of thousands could have been much worse, many homes will never be the same. With our eyes on the Lord, our parents and students were indeed glad to return to classroom learning on 5th January, 2021! We have experienced God's favour on the health and safety of our students, teachers, staff and parents. We adjusted to temperature checks and wearing masks. We prayed together that God would give us increased wisdom to navigate the journey! He sees the end from the beginning of everything.

The Ministry of Education calendar extended Term 3, 2021 until April, 2022 so once again this second issue of Our Highlights touches on four different years of our journey. Welcome once more to a declaration of God's goodness for His glory!

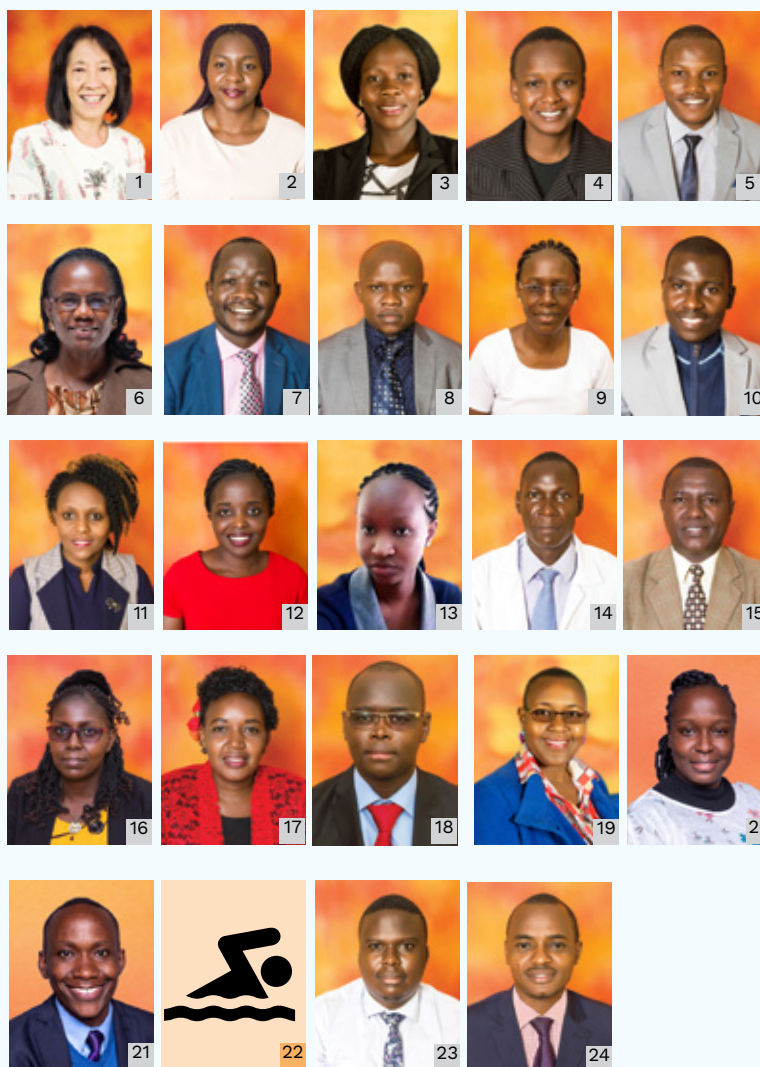

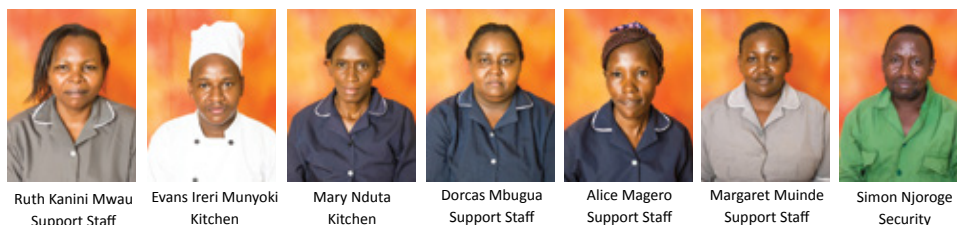

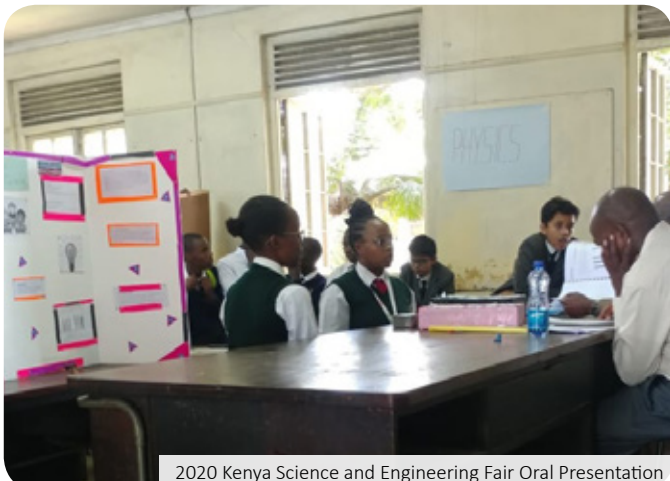

It was the most challenging time now that practical work like titration or electricity could not be done online but glory to God that students acquired a lot of theoretical knowledge.

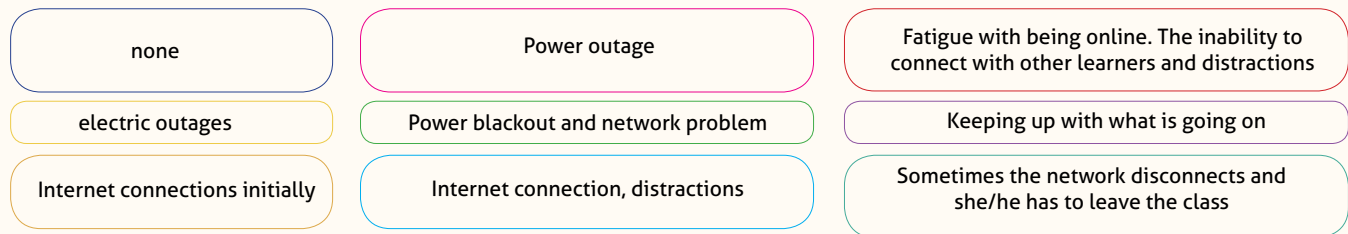
N. Wasuna

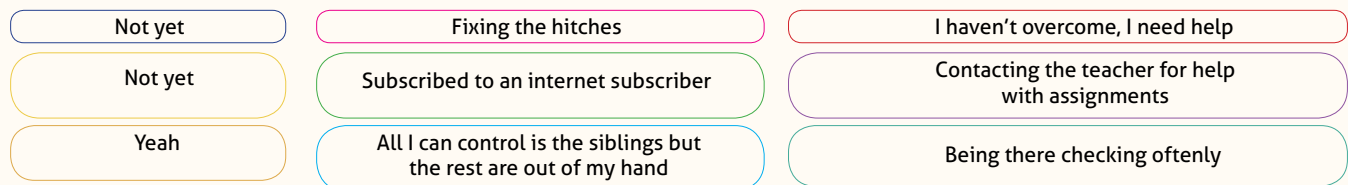
T. Onyapidi

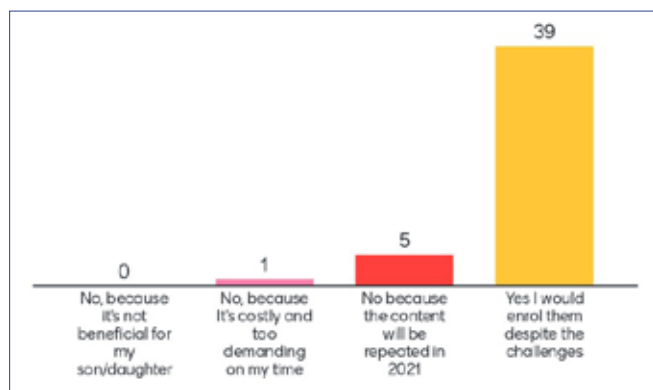
What challenges have you or your son/daughter encountered with online learning?



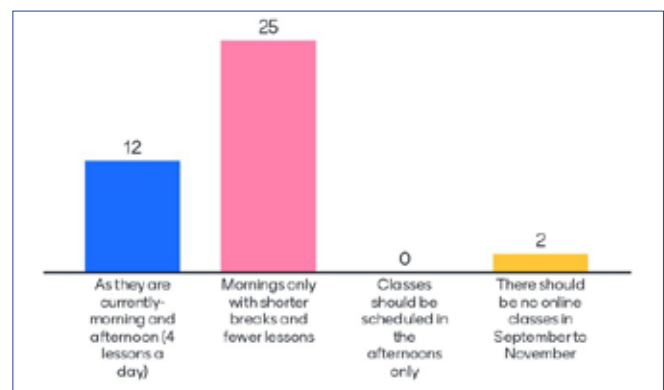
How have you overcome these challenges?



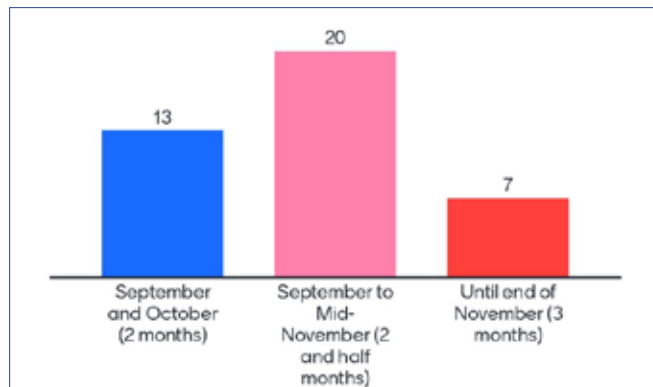
If online classes are offered at TRCHS in September - November season, would you enrol your son/daughter?



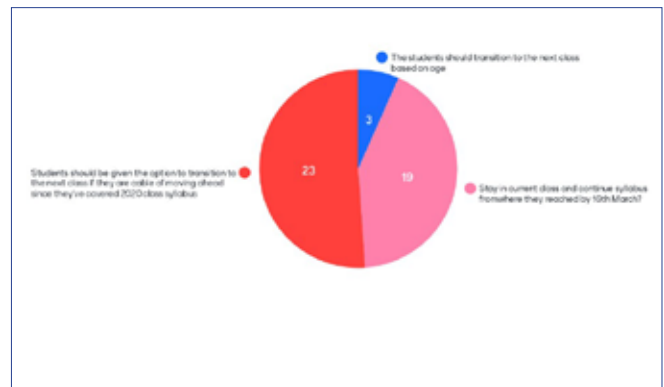
How should online classes be scheduled during September to November season?



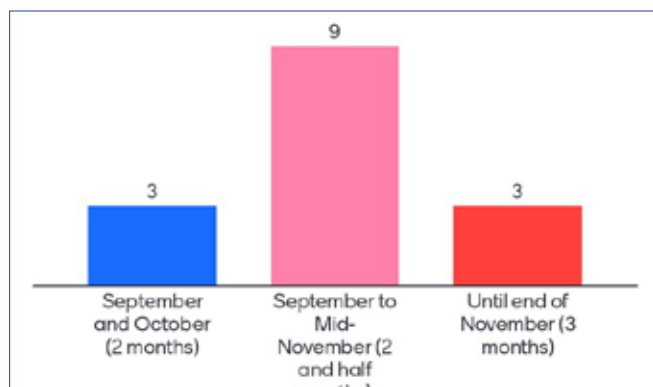
During the September - November period, how long should online learning continue?

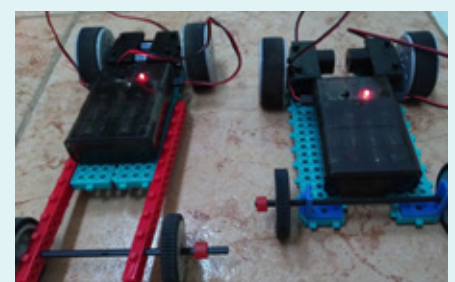

Ecclesiastes 9:10, Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.

In my view, Working Smart means,

1. Know - Without Christ we can do nothing.

Without Christ, you can do nothing. Just what does this mean exactly? Without Jesus we can do nothing of eternal significance. "We are powerless without Christ to build eternal things; we are spiritually poor and without power outside of Christ! PLANTING TREES





JOHN 16:33

"These things I have spoken unto you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulations; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

Notice it does not say you may have tribulations but it says you will have tribulations. The question therefore is not whether we will have tribulations but when we will have. Now you are either going through trials or you just came out of trials or you are about to go through some trials. As it was once said, we can make our difficult times look like a mirror or a window. We can take our dark night of adversity and make it a mirror to look into and be overcome with self-pity. This is what leads to suicide, depressions and at times people making cuttings on their bodies due to anxiety. Or we can make our difficult times a window to see through by looking at people who have gone through the same trial. The mirror reveals us; the window shows us the world filled with people who are walking or have walked the same path. Today I don't want us to take our trials like a mirror but a window.

Declaration: God wants us to take our trials like a window.

1. Job- Being genuine in trials.

Job lived in the land of Ur, he had seven sons and three daughters. He also has great possessions; seven thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen, five hundred female donkeys and a great household. This great wealth that Job had gave Satan a reason to think that Job was not worshipping God genuinely but out of what gave him. God gave him permission to try Job but not to get rid of him. Satan killed all his ten children and about eleven thousand five hundred animals that he possessed, now that is what I call Job becoming Jobless, he was stripped of all things. There was a story of a man who was a missionary in a certain village and after preaching for several occasions and seeing no one was coming he made a board outside the church that said "free food after the service". As expected, people stormed into the church and he had a massive congregation. After a period of time, he stopped supplying the food and the number of people started reducing eventually to nothing, now should the missionary be surprised? Unless he did not know what he was doing because the truth is this, how you win people is how you maintain them. If Job was won over by God through those great possessions that he had he could have cursed him that moment he had sore boils all over his body. The reality of the matter is that Job was genuine in his worship, he was like gold that passed through fire and came out precious. Oh! How we complain even though we never go through half of those trials at the same moment. May we say like Job, "Shall we indeed accept good from God, and shall we not accept adversity?" Job 2:10

2. Paul- Rejoicing in trials.

"Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I say rejoice!" (Phil 4:4). Indeed, this is a short verse brethren, all of us can memorize it and even sing it, but not all of us know the background of these simple words. The book of Philippians is a prison epistle which was written when Paul was in house imprisonment in Rome, with a chain on his hands. This is a man who ought to say "Help me. Again, I say Help me! But no, he did not, you may ask where does such a man gather strength to say such words at his moment of great trial, I will tell you it is in the same book of the same chapter, verse thirteen, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. "This is a verse many people know and have memorized but the danger is that when a verse becomes too familiar to us, we tend to take it out of context. Pertaining this picture you will see a man in the internet carrying a huge load, it is even used in the gymnasium, now if I were to go to the gym and knowing that you know me, tall, dark and slim and I ask

for the heaviest weight that they have and I say I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me and lift the weight, guess what, I will break myself and it is not that I am mocking God and limiting His ability but because I know there is a line between what we call faith and trying God and remember, don't put your God to test and clearly the context is different if you just read the whole chapter. Paul is thanking them for their generosity and then says that I don't speak so that you can give me more for I have learnt to be content whether I am satisfied or in need and why is that, because I can do all things and face all circumstances because God gives me strength. Our joy must therefore not be linked to circumstances but to the Lord. 3. Jesus Christ- Submitting in trials.

Now our greatest example is our Lord Jesus Christ, He left heaven with all its glory and came and suffered for our sins but it all started in the Garden of Gethsemane where he groaned in pain and we see that there are three ways that show how he approached his trials;

I. He asked for deliverance. (Matthew 27:39)

Jesus asked if it is possible to let the cup of trials that waited for him pass from him. We see that he was not demanding since he concluded not my but your will be done. God in his word commands us to pray to him when we are in trials and it is right for us during those difficult times to cry to him for deliverance.

II. He asked for acceptance. (Matthew 26:42)

Our problem is that we wait on the deliverance too long we never or hardly ask for acceptance, when then will we be saved from this song "Save me! Will you save me now! Save me now the pain is too hard to bear, if you tarry this long, I may look for another alternative, maybe a witch doctor." Oh! instead of threatening God when will you ever accept it? III. He asked for glorification. (John 12:27-28)

Jesus accepted his trials so that God may be glorified. The reason why we must accept our trials is so that God may be glorified. Both the man who was born blind and the death of Lazarus were all trials to manifest and glorify God in later stages, the trials that we may go through now may be a source of comfort to others when we share them and also a way to glorify God. God does not comfort us to be comfortable but so that we can comfort others, may we then in our trials seek to glorify God just as our Lord Jesus Christ did.

Conclusion: My father was a very hardworking man and he was the best person to be around when he was sober, and things used to be fine until he was introduced to alcohol. Sometimes he would come home drunk and the house would be unsettled due to the fights that went on and on, now I cannot change that therefore I can not continually dwell on it and you also don't have to continually dwell on the past. We cannot change our past but we can change our future. Knowing what drugs do to a person that they can change them to an animal that means I don't have to take drugs, and if God ever gives me a wife in the future, I should not mistreat her but treat her with love and respect that is due to her. Trials indeed will always be there but let us remember that faith in Christ is not about safety and caution, it is about believing Jesus and trusting him no matter what.

Dear Lord this morning I humbly present our children to you. Give them minds and hearts that remain faithful to

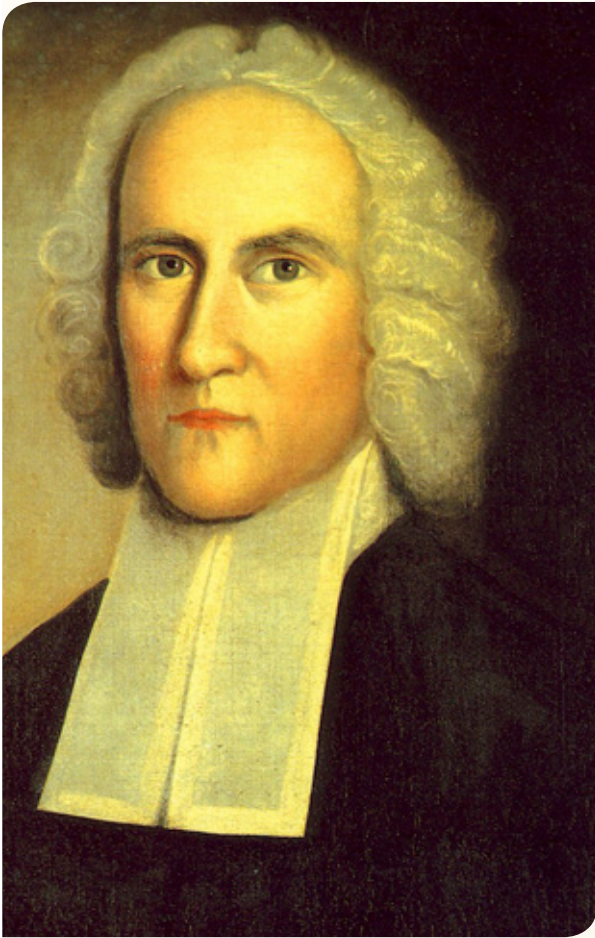
You all the days of their lives in Jesus' name.

Jonathan Edwards, was a Puritan Preacher in the 1700s. He was one of the most respected preachers in his day. He attended Yale at the age of thirteen and later went on to become the president of Princeton college. He married his wife Sara in 1727 and they were blessed with eleven children. Every night when Mr. Edwards was home, he would spend an hour conversing with his family and then praying a blessing over each child. Jonathan and his wife Sarah passed on a great, godly legacy to their children.

An American educator, A.E. Winship decided to trace the descendants of Jonathan Edwards almost 150 years after his death. His findings are remarkable, especially when compared to another man from the same time period known as Max Jukes.

Jonathan Edwards' legacy includes:

- 1 U.S. Vice-President,
- 1 Dean of a law school,
- 1 dean of a medical school,
- 3 U.S. Senators,
- 3 governors,
- 3 mayors,
- 13 college presidents,
- 30 judges,
- 60 doctors,
- 65 professors,
- 75 Military officers,
- 80 public office holders,
- 100 lawyers,
- 100 clergymen, and
- 285 college graduates.

How may this be explained? Edwards was a godly man, but he was also hard working, intelligent and moral.

Furthermore, Winship states, "Much of the capacity and talent, intensity and character of the more than 1,400 of Edwards' family is due to Mrs. Edwards."

Max Jukes' legacy came to people's attention when the family trees of 42 different men in the New York prison system were traced back to him. He lived in New York at about the same period as Edwards. The Jukes family originally was studied by sociologist Richard L. Dugdale in 1877.

Jukes' descendants included:

- 7 murderers,
- 60 thieves,
- 190 prostitutes,
- 150 other convicts,
- 310 paupers, and
- 440 who were physically wrecked by addiction to alcohol.

Of the 1,200 descendants that were studied, 300 died prematurely.

These contrasting legacies provide an example of what some call the five-generation rule. "How a parent raises their child — the love they give, the values they teach, the emotional environment they offer, the education they provide — influences not only their children but the four generations to follow, either for good or evil." What a challenging thought! If someone studied your descendants four generations later, what would you want them to discover? Do you want an Edwards' legacy or a Jukes' legacy? The life you live will determine the legacy you leave!
